

RESOLUTION NO. 12-2023

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF INDIAN SHORES, FLORIDA, DECLARING THE POLICE DEPARTMENT’S 2016 DODGE CHARGER, VIN 2C3CDXCT8GH218939, TITLE NUMBER 1233318924, AS SURPLUS PROPERTY, FINDING THERE IS NO LONGER A NEED FOR PUBLIC USE OR FOR A PUBLIC PURPOSE OF THE PROPERTY; PROVIDING FOR INCORPORATION OF FINDINGS AND RECITALS; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF RESOLUTIONS OR PARTS OF RESOLUTIONS INCONSISTENT HERewith; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR LIBERAL CONSTRUCTION; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Town of Indian Shores, Florida, (“TOWN”) is a municipal corporation located within Pinellas County; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council may dispose of Town property that no longer serves a municipal public purpose; and

WHEREAS, the Town has not adopted formal standards or value thresholds regarding disposal of unused Town property which no longer serves a municipal purpose; and

WHEREAS, in 2016 the Police Department received a Dodge Charger from the Institute of Police Technology and Manager under the Florida Law Enforcement Challenge, Project # PT-16-12-06; and

WHEREAS, the Town is required to notify the State Safety Office of the requested disposition of the property; and

WHEREAS, the Town is required to dispose of the property in accordance with 49 CFR Part 19, Subpart C, Property Standards, Subsection 19.34, Equipment; and

WHEREAS, the Indian Shores Police Department no longer has a need for the vehicle, which has reached the end of it’s useful life and no longer serves a municipal purpose; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council desires to have the property declared as surplus, and direct the Police Chief or his designee to dispose of the property accordingly;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF INDIAN SHORES, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Town Council hereby finds the above statements to be true and correct, and incorporated as a material part of this Resolution.

Section 2. The Town Council hereby declares that the Dodge Charger formerly utilized by the Police Department is no longer serving its purpose and is therefore surplus property; furthermore, the Town Council directs the Police Chief, or his designee, to dispose of the same in accordance with State and Federal law, and notify the State Safety Office for further instruction and reporting of same.

Section 3. That if any provision of this Resolution is found to be invalid or unenforceable as a matter of law by a court of competent jurisdiction, the offending provision(s) shall be severed and the remainder shall continue in full force and effect.

Section 4. That all Resolutions or portions of Resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5. That the terms and provisions of this Resolution shall be liberally constructed to affect the purpose for which it is adopted.

Section 6. That this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon passage and adoption in the manner provided by law.

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The above and foregoing Resolution, upon Motion by Councilor Bill Smith and seconded by Councilor Mike Petruccelli, was duly approved and adopted at a regular Town of Indian Shores Town Council meeting held on the 9th day of May, 2023.
